Florence Marie Lasich, 83, died peacefully on Monday June 23 with family at her bedside. Florence was born on March 13, 1931 in Farmington Michigan, to William A. and Pearl B. (Heliker) Tamm. Strong in her faith, she found time to serve as the secretary and organist for Salem United Church of Christ in Farmington, and later continued serving and playing the organ for the First Christian Church in Manton. She also served as the Greenwood Township treasurer while living in Wexford County.

There is no doubt that Florence was greeted at the gates of heaven by Jack. She was also preceded in death by her parents, and sisters Mary Lowe and Wilma Aho.




“ Hi, Jackie,
