TRAVERSE CITY — Margaret Holczman, 92, of Traverse City, passed away on Sept. 22, 2015.

Margaret was born on May 29, 1923 in Hamtramck, to the late Simon and Marie (Czenski) Prechesky. She married Vincent J. Holczman on Jan. 18, 1941 in Dearborn. They had six children together and celebrated 58 years of marriage.

Margaret worked at Fisher Body in Flint. The couple resided in Ovid, where they owned and operated a tv and radio business. In 1969, they relocated to Traverse City where they owned and managed the Flintstone Bar together.

Margaret was an active member of St. Patrick Catholic Church and auxiliary member of the VFW. She enjoyed reading, crocheting and knitting, gardening and growing her beloved irises.
