

Robert L Fifarek
July 21, 1921 - August 14, 2014

Robert Lee Fifarek, age 93, passed away, Thursday, August14, 2014, at Traverse Victorian Senior Living Community.

Robert was born to Joseph and Anna (Kelenski) Fifarek on July 21, 1921, in Traverse City, Michigan.

He was married to Dorothy A. (Chase) Fifarek on June 8, 1946, at Saint Francis Catholic Church in Traverse City.

As a child, Robert enjoyed riding bikes, roller skating, and playing basketball, baseball and football with his friends. Robert peddled papers on the West side from the age of eleven until he was fourteen. He began hunting with his father when he was eleven years old and shot his first rabbit at that age. He and his dad hunted all over the Traverse City area, and Robert enjoyed regaling the entire family with stories of these experiences. He also enjoyed fishing. He was an outdoorsman for the rest of his life. He added golf to his interests as an adult, playing on company leagues or with family members and friends. While traveling during his retirement, Robert would often play a round of golf at an area course of the community he was visiting.

Robert graduated from Traverse City Central High School in 1939, where he studied a commercial course. He participated in football for four years. As a starting guard in 1937 and 1938, he and his football team won the Big North Conference Championships, and he was also a member of the first team to play under the Thirlby Field lights in 1937. Following graduation in 1939, Robert attended Lewis Chapman School of Business, studying accounting. Robert worked at the Traverse City tennis courts after high school until 1941 when he was hired by Michigan Bell Telephone Company as a lineman.

Robert joined the U.S. Naval Reserves in July of 1942. Within that branch of the armed forces, he served with the Capital Construction Battalion, the Seabees. In November of 1942, he shipped out as part of the invasion of North Africa on the troop transport U.S.

Thurston. As part of the invasion, he was stationed in Casablanca, Port Lyaute, at Craw Field, in Oran, and eventually landed in Sicily. In 1943 he headed to Saipan via the islands, spending some time on Marcus Island, which was eight hundred miles from Japan. He was discharged from the Navy in 1945 at Great Lakes in Chicago.

Following World War II, Robert returned to work for Michigan Bell Telephone Company, first as a lineman, then as line foreman, then with the engineering department. In 1953, he and his family moved to Manistee. He served as Plant Chief for Michigan Bell under the title of Exchange Repair Foreman - X. Robert worked there until he was transferred back to Traverse City in 1972. Robert continued to serve as Plant Chief until he retired in 1978.

In 1955, the cottage on Long Lake, owned by Dorothy's parents burned to the ground. Robert spent that summer demolishing the remains of the structure. Over the following summers, Robert transformed this second cottage into a summer home for the family, until it was expanded and remodeled into their retirement home in 1980.

Robert served on the board of directors of the Traverse City Athletic Boosters and did much to support the High School football teams. He was also very active with Special Olympics. While he was in Manistee, Robert was a member of the Jaycees and president of the Lions Club. He was also president of the Manistee-Cadillac and Traverse City chapters of the Pioneers.

Robert was a founding member of the Saint Patrick Catholic Church.

Robert was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy; his parents; his in-laws, Raymond and Rosa Chase; three sisters, Joan Fifarek, Georgia Fifarek Lynch Synnestvedt, and Alice Fifarek Wright; a brother, Edward Fifarek; three brothers-in-law, Dr. Philip Lynch, Norman Synnestvedt, and William Wright; a sister-in-law, Nellie McFarren Chase; and his great-granddaughter, Sophia Rose Fifarek.

Robert is survived by two daughters, Rosanne Fifarek and Mary Jo Fifarek, both of Traverse City; and two sons, John Fifarek of Haslett, and James (Jan) Fifarek of Grand Rapids. He is also survived by his brother-in-law, William R. Chase of Kalkaska; his former daughter-in-law, Lori Hydeck of Sarasota, Florida; five grandchildren, Dr. Chase (Katie) Fifarek, Dr. John Fifarek, Jr., Lauren Fifarek, Sara Fifarek and Kalli Fifarek; seven nephews and numerous relatives and close friends. Especially dear to him was his great-granddaughter, Ellie Alona Fifarek.

The family would like to thank Deacon Rene Hoenscheid for his frequent and caring

attention. We also wish to express gratitude to the staff of Traverse Victorian and Hospice of Michigan for their gentle care of our father during his last few days.
